### Amigos Success Story

Greetings to you! My name is Javier Moisés Pech Ek. I would like to share some of my life memories with you. The first memory is when I was little and my mother came home saying that we would be sponsored by an American family - and that they would help us with food and school supplies. She told us that the only thing they wanted in return from us was that we make good grades and put in our best effort in order to do well in school.



Another memory that I have from when I was little, and one that I did

not understand (at the time), is that even though my mom was always dealing with severe  $\checkmark$  diabetes, she was willing to take care of all of her children and support us along with our  $\checkmark$  aunts and uncles. In addition to taking care of us and herself, she was also working hard to  $\checkmark$  give us a better in life.

The Amigos Program of the Mission of Friendship was a great blessing for my mother, for  $\checkmark$  my siblings María Alejandra, Josué Israel, Daniel Isaías, Irene Berenice and I, because  $\checkmark$  thanks to the support of our sponsors' contributions, we had the opportunity to continue  $\checkmark$  studying. It was not easy, but we worked hard to overcome all of our difficulties.

Because of my mother's illness a lot of money was spent on her medications and other treatments. I remember that we began to receive help with groceries. And we received cash gifts to help pay for my mother's medical expenses. My siblings married very young, had children, and began living in their own houses with their families. I was not married. I continued studying. My goal was to finish high school, and when I finished it, I would have the opportunity to go to university. Thanks to the support of my sponsors, and with gratitude for their belief in me, I went to the National Technological Institute of Mexico, Conkal Campus, which is located in a small town outside of Mérida. I graduated from the Agricultural Engineering Program.

Attending school was hard for me especially during my first year. To get to class on time I had to leave home at 4:40 a.m. There were many days when I couldn't get breakfast. The transportation was tough also, since I had to take two bus rides and a van to get there. Sometimes, when I missed my last ride, I had to walk to campus, as the classes used to start at 7:00 a.m. As my studies progressed the school expenses increased - in supplies, in bus fares, and books.

When COVID started in 2020, everything changed for the worse. My siblings sometimes had  $\checkmark$  work, and sometimes not. There were days that we had some money, and days with nothing.

After many challenges and financial struggles, I was finally able to get into my professional residency (internship) which was a requirement for graduation. I did this internship at the Tecnológico laboratories in Conkal. When I finally finished the university program, I graduated with an average grade of 90.

I overcame all the obstacles, the late nights, the forced fasts, the stress, the expenses -- not only personal but also family problems. But I thank God for my family for supporting me. And I also express deep gratitude to the Mission of Friendship Amigos program and my sponsors for being in my life and in my school journey. Their support made it possible for me to move forward in life. I will always be grateful for becoming an Agricultural Engineer.

#### Some Important Reminders

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of important points. The Mission Office in Erie will continue to receive the donations sent by **Amigos sponsors**, **Nueva Vida sponsors**, **Day Care sponsors and Sister Parishes** by way of checks and online credit card contributions. These funds will be wired periodically to the mission account in Mérida.
