



Child Protection Education for Religious Education Parents

Dioceses have been mandated by the U.S. Bishops' Conference (USCCB) to provide inservicing regarding proper conduct and the procedure for response to child abuse not only for children and youth, but also for their parents. They also state: *"It may be difficult to ensure all parents in a parish are adequately informed about the issue of child abuse. To reach as many parents as possible, attempts should be made to provide various types of instruction. Multiple delivery methods could include formal training sessions led by experienced child-safety professionals, independent reading material, videos, or information posted on the diocesan web-site."*

All parents must receive some information regarding Child Abuse/Safe Environment **EVERY YEAR**. It is the prerogative of the religious education program to choose the material and the means which will best accomplish this requirement. The parish will be asked for the number of parents inserviced/sent information on the *Annual Parish Report for Child Protection Compliance* each year.

To this end, the diocesan Office for Protection of Children and Youth offers the following suggestions for the mandated dissemination of information to all parents in our parishes.

- Contact the service agencies in your area to provide an evening in-service for parents. Agencies who are conducting the inservicing of the children all have programs for adults. For a listing of county agencies, click on <http://www.eriescd.org/pdf/county.pdf>
- Supply booklets, pamphlets or some reading material regarding the subject of child abuse to each family in your program. Use the Diocesan Parent Training Packet found at the Child Protection web site (<http://www.eriescd.org/protectyouth.htm>) or use the various age-appropriate sections of it to supply information to parents. The brochure from the diocese titled *Frequently asked Questions about Child Abuse* (<http://www.eriescd.org/pdf/abusebroch.pdf>) can be downloaded and copied (or purchased from the diocese) and distributed to all parents. A copy of this flyer could also be put in each parish bulletin to more widely disseminate the information. Pamphlet racks could be installed in the church, school or religious education center. Information can also be included in a religious education parent newsletter. Check out the list at the end of this document for additional sources of parent inservice material. - The *Safe Environment* video program, produced by the diocese featuring Msgr. McSweeney, is an appropriate resource for the inservice of parents. Each parish and religious education program has a copy of this program. Use the outline presented at the facilitator training meetings. Show the DVD to a group of parents or allow parents to borrow the parish DVD to view at home.
