

The regional processions will take place according to the following schedules:

- St. Peter Cathedral, Erie: Bishop Persico will celebrate the 11:00 am Mass. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at the end of Mass. The Procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 2:00 pm.
- Holy Redeemer Parish, Warren: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at 2:30 pm for a period of adoration. The procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 3:00 pm.
- St. Catherine of Sienna, Dubois: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration at the end of the 10:00 am Mass. The procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 2:00 pm.
- Immaculate Heart of Mary, Mercer: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration at the end of the 10:00 am Mass. The Procession with the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 2:15 pm. Upon returning to the church building, the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be prayed followed by benediction.
- St. Mary's, St. Marys: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed at 2:00 pm. The procession will form and travel to Sacred Heart Church, stopping at various points along the way for readings from Scripture and benediction. Once the procession reaches Sacred Heart, benediction will conclude the celebration.
- Epiphany of the Lord Parish, Meadville. The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration at the end of the 11:30 am Mass at St. Agatha Church. The procession will form at 2:30 pm moving to St. Brigid Church. After pausing at St. Brigid for prayer, the procession will return to St. Agatha Church for benediction.
- St. Callistus, Kane: The Blessed Sacrament will be exposed for adoration at end of 10:30 Mass. The procession will begin at 1:00 pm. At 1:30 the procession returns to church for devotional prayers and benediction ending around 2:00 pm.
- St. Patrick, Franklin: The procession will begin at 3:00 pm.
