Jubilee vocab: Decade - In the Rosary, a decade means ten Hail Marys with one Our Father. Each decade helps us think about a mystery—a special story from the lives of Jesus and Mary.



Hey, Kids of Christ! October is the Month of the Rosary, and Luce has a special craft to help you pray in a new way. Gather a string or pipe cleaner and some beads. You'll need ten smaller beads to remind you of the Hail Marys, and one larger bead to remind you of the

Our Father. Together, those beads make a "decade" of the rosary!

As you slide the beads onto your string, pause to whisper the prayer each one stands for. When you wear your bracelet, it becomes more than just decoration—it's a little rosary you can keep with you, ready to help you pray anytime.



Our Lady of the Rosary, also known as Our Lady of Victory, reminds us of the power of praying the Rosary. It began as thanksgiving for victory at the Battle of Lepanto, but today it invites us all to trust in prayer as our greatest strength.
