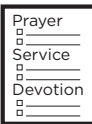

## HEY, KIDS OF CHRIST!

**Jubilee vocab: Confraternity** - A group of Catholics who work together to serve others, grow in faith and spread God's love—like the Knights of Columbus or St. Vincent de Paul Society.



Join Luce in learning about confraternities by making a family “mission board.” On a piece of paper, create three sections: **Prayer** – choose one way your family will pray together this week (like a rosary or grace before meals); **Service** – pick one way to help someone in need (visit a neighbor, donate food, clean up a park); and

**Devotion** – select a saint to learn about or celebrate (like St. Vincent de Paul, St. Joseph or Our Lady of the Rosary). Just like a real confraternity!



**St. Joseph and the Blessed Virgin Mary**, the earthly parents of Jesus, model a holy family rooted in faith, love and trust in God. Joseph is honored for his humble obedience and protection, while Mary is revered for her loving discipleship and faithful “yes” to God’s will.

## FAITHFUL FACTS!

The Jubilee of Musical Bands celebrates the joy and unity that music brings to the life of the church. On June 8, 2024, in one of his public addresses, Pope Francis told musicians: “Music creates harmony, thereby reaching everyone—consoling those who suffer and rekindling enthusiasm in the weary.”
