CALLED TO CONNECT

When Pope Francis announced this Jubilee, he observed, "The Jubilee reminds us that the goods of the earth are not destined for a privileged few but for everyone." He pointed to the basis for the Jubilee in Leviticus 25 and reminded us to hear the prophets: the universal destination of goods is at the heart of our theology of creation. We understand God's creation best when we consider what is good for all and not only what is good for some.

This reminder builds on the teaching Pope Francis gave us in 'Laudato Si'. There, he reinforced the universal destination of goods and gave us a renewed image of creation in which everything and everyone is connected. Our proper care and concern for all creation affirms the connections God has woven between all its parts.

Pope Francis called us to be "tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind." As the Church, the Body of Christ, we can answer his call by modeling the sharing of goods and the care of creation for the world. May God, our creator, empower us to be signs of hope in Christ's footsteps.
