

Deacon Shewman Returns to the Islands to Present Seminar

In August, Deacon Richard Shewman, a judge in the Tribunal of the Diocese of Erie, returned to the Mariana Islands where he lived for many years. He was invited by the Diocese of Chalan Kanoa to present a seminar on the topic of Child Protection Procedures. Deacon Shewman worked for the Diocese of Chalan Kanoa from 1988 to 1997 as its Chancellor and Moderator of the Curia. This is his first visit back since he and his family moved to Erie in 1997.
