The preparation for Confirmation Masses has changed in many ways. Please fully read this entire packet and print out all pages. If you have any questions, feel free to contact the Office for Divine Worship at 814-824-1271 or Worship@ErieRCD.org. Many thanks!

Please note the following important items for confirmation celebrations in 2024:

- Group or individual photos with the Bishop will take place only in the Church immediately following the confirmation Mass. Please organize photos accordingly. The Bishop will visit the reception afterward but will not remain vested for formal pictures.
- 2. The Bishop intends to arrive at the confirmation site approximately one hour prior to the start of the Mass. Please have a private room or office designated for him to vest and prepare for Mass.
- 3. So that he may recognize and acknowledge them appropriately, the Bishop requests that pastors convey to him prior to the confirmation, the names of any particular parishioners, religious, or public officials in attendance whom the Bishop should acknowledge. This information can be communicated through the Office for Divine Worship.
- 4. A meal is not required but if a dinner is held, please begin at 5:30 pm for weekday confirmations (Monday-Friday.) Lunches or dinners for weekend confirmations can be scheduled individually through the Office for Divine Worship. This is to assist the Bishop with his travel plans.
- 5. Pastors and administrators are asked to review this packet before giving it to their confirmation coordinator.

CONFIRMATION 2024: Liturgy Planning Notes

- The Office for Divine Worship will prepare <u>all</u> Confirmation Liturgies and will email a short questionnaire to the pastor of each place of celebration for the selected music, readers, servers, etc.
- Mass: The Bishop will use the text of the Ritual Mass for Confirmation with red vestments whenever possible. This would apply to all confirmations in 2024 except for the following days (and the anticipated Masses which precede them):
 - o all Sundays of Lent
 - o all Sundays of Easter
 - The Octave of Easter
 - Saint Joseph (March 19)
 - Annunciation of the Lord (April 8)
 - Ascension of the Lord (May 9)
 - Christ the King (November 24)
- Readings: The readings for the Confirmation Liturgies (except for those days mentioned above) will be as follows:

Outside the Easter Season:	Isaiah 42:1-3, Lectionary 764-2 Ephesians 1:3a, 4a, 13-19a, Lectionary 765-11 Luke 4:16-22a, Lectionary 768-5		
Easter Weekday:	Acts 2:1-6, 14, 22b-23, 32-33, Lectionary 765-2 Galatians 5:16-17, 22-23a, 24-25, Lectionary 765-10 John 15:18-21, 26-27, Lectionary 768-11		

- Servers: Parishes are asked to schedule three to five (five is preferred, if possible) altar servers who should be at the church at least 30 minutes prior to the start of Mass. If fewer than three servers are available, please let the Office for Divine Worship know ahead of time. In the absence of student servers, adult servers are welcome.
- A lector (even a candidate for confirmation) carries the Book of the Gospels only in the absence of a deacon, since the ministry of proclaiming the Gospel (and carrying the Book) belongs properly to deacons.
- The Gloria is required for all Confirmation Liturgies except for the Sundays of Lent (Roman Missal Ritual Masses #1, 4. Conferral of Confirmation).
- Candidates should not wear nametags, stoles, or albs.
- Only one person is to read the prepared "Calling of Candidates" sent by the Office for Divine Worship.
- In planning the method by which candidates with their sponsors will approach the Bishop for the anointing with chrism, please avoid having people standing in the pew, since this blocks the view of those sitting behind them.
- The Universal Prayer must include at least one intercession for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

- The Bishop requires that students choose confirmation names which can be found in Butler's Lives of the Saints, or saints who have been named by the Church since 1900. Students should be led to choose names of saints whose lives are grounded in fact, not in legend. Please see Religious Education Policy 631.14 for a full explanation of saintselection criteria.
- Music during confirmation should follow the 2008 guidelines established by the United States Bishops as published in *Sing to the Lord*, nos. 137-199.
- If you use worship aids in your pews, use screens, and/or are live streaming, remember to report all usage of the music used to your licensing company (OneLicense.net, CCLI, etc.) If live streaming, please be sure you have the proper subscription with your music licensing company.

NOTICE

On the Recording of the Reception of Confirmation

With the increase of combined-parish celebrations of the sacrament of confirmation, the question of how to record reception of the sacrament has become increasingly complicated.

In accord with the decree issued by Bishop Trautman on May 23, 2005 concerning the method by which confirmations are to be recorded in the Diocese of Erie, pastors should make note of the following:

- 1. Each pastor is to record in full the reception of the sacrament of confirmation by his own parishioners, including reference to the place of confirmation if the reception of the sacrament takes place outside of that pastor's parish church.
- 2. Furthermore, the pastor of the place of confirmation is to note in the confirmation register the names of all those confirmed at that place, being sure to include at least their names, the date, the name of the minister of confirmation, and the parish where the complete record can be found.
- 3. Each pastor should make the appropriate notation for his own parishioners in the baptismal register of his parish and should send notification of confirmation to the place of baptism for those baptized elsewhere.

Anything to the contrary notwithstanding.
