### A focus on

## COVID-19 can't stop...

## Service

Catholic Charities agencies provide help and create hope throughout the year. But during this year when COVID-19 hit, our agencies have risen to the challenge of leaving no need unmet. As front-line workers, they continue to provide services regardless of religious, social or economic backgrounds.

Pre-pandemic, **St. Martin Center** provided an average of 374 monthly food distributions to families in need. This number nearly tripled in March 2020. And in April, May and June of this year, it remained 22 percent higher than pre-pandemic numbers with an average of 457 monthly distributions.



**Prince of Peace Center** in Mercer County saw a 20 percent increase in soup kitchen meals this year as compared to last year. The weekly food distributions saw an initial 27 percent spike in March. Needs are expected to grow again as the pandemic continues to hit communities hard.

Our agencies are also seeing a decrease in the self-generated revenue they count on in order to provide their essential services. **St. Elizabeth Center's** thrift store had to close for several months during the worst of the COVID-19 outbreak. As a result, thrift store revenue is down about \$4,000 from what was expected. The ongoing need for food assistance in the Oil City region is expected

to persist as the economic impact of the pandemic continues to spread.

Christ the King Manor in DuBois, and Saint John XXIII Home in Hermitage, each have done an extraordinary job in keeping their residents and staff safe and healthy despite unimaginable odds of contracting COVID-19. Additionally, they continue to find creative ways for residents to experience community through activities and visits within their facilities. At the same time, they are helping residents stay connected to family members through technology



and innovative outdoor booth visits. Staff have gone the extra mile in ensuring the health and safety of all.

These examples highlight just a few of our Catholic Charities agencies, all of which have continued to serve people in need throughout this difficult time. COVID-19 may

have stopped a lot of things in 2020, but our dedication and assistance to people in need has continued, and will continue, for as long as there is need.



If you are one of the hundreds of individuals who usually attend the Catholic Charities' annual Club CC Night fundraiser, you know that it had to be cancelled in order to protect the safety and well-being of our community. During this time, Catholic Charities had to rethink how that critical financial support could still be raised.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Catholic Charities launched a community relief fund in the spring of 2020. This was done in collaboration with the Diocese of Erie to support specific emergency outreach efforts through agencies, diocesan ministries and parishes. The goal was to offer support broadly and promote Catholic giving for immediate needs.

With donations to the Emergency Relief Fund, and the generous Club CC sponsors who agreed to redirect their sponsorships to COVID relief efforts, \$67,326 has been granted to 21 parishes for their outreach efforts, eight Catholic Charities agencies and three other ministries in our region with emergency needs.

We are grateful to all who have supported our efforts to help those in need. The following areas benefited greatly from this effort: Clarion, Clearfield, DuBois, Erie, Farrell, Grampian, Greenville, Harborcreek, Hermitage, Kersey, Linesville, Lucinda, Meadville, North East, Oil City, Punxsutawney, Reynoldsville and Warren.

## A legacy of generosity for those in need

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Erie, Inc. is pleased to announce the Catholic Charities Legacy Endowment. The purpose of the endowment is to fund the operational needs of the agencies in the Catholic Charities network, including support of programs that provide direct services to people in need.

This endowment, newly established with The Catholic Foundation of Northwest PA, is being seeded by the generous bequests of Mark Kulyk and Msgr. William Biebel, two longtime supporters of the good works of Catholic Charities in the Diocese of Erie.



Mark is described in the words of his wife Joyce as a generous, caring person who was dedicated to his faith. Mark's passion for helping people in need led him to volunteer at the local Catholic Charities agency when he and Joyce lived in Virginia, and then he continued this commitment to Catholic Charities in Erie soon after

they moved to the region in 1984. Joyce is thrilled that Catholic Charities has used Mark's bequest to seed this new legacy endowment. She says, "Mark would be pleased, too. This is how he can stay involved in the work he was so passionate about."





Msgr. William Biebel also had a long history of working with Catholic Charities, and part of his final wishes was to include a gift to Catholic Charities in his estate plans. His entire lifetime was spent in service to the Diocese of Erie, and

according to Msgr. Biebel's friend and executor of his estate, Michael Gaines, he was known to have "great concern for people. He wanted



them to be helped." Msgr. Biebel wouldn't hesitate to refer someone in need to a Catholic Charities agency while he was alive, and in his final act

of generosity, he made a bequest in order to continue the good works of Catholic Charities.

Catholic Charities has decided to use these two legacy gifts not only to honor the generosity of Mark Kulyk and Msgr. Biebel, but also to ensure that their gifts last into the future and continue the work to which they were so committed. By establishing the Catholic Charities Legacy Endowment, Catholic Charities ensures that their gifts give forever.

Ann Badach, executive director of Catholic Charities, says of the endowment "the board of Catholic Charities believes that every act of Christian charity creates a ripple effect — many are helped from every gift. We hope that the establishment of this legacy endowment may inspire others to honor their own loved ones and enlarge the ripple effect created by this gift to help others in need."
