

Creating a Safe Environment

Adult Online Training for Child Protection

Please read the following information **BEFORE** you begin the training: Training must be viewed in one sitting. YOU MUST BE CONNECTED TO A PRINTER TO PRINT YOUR CERTIFICATE UPON COMPLETION OF TRAINING. It is not possible to return to the certificate unless you <u>REPEAT</u> <u>THE TRAINING.</u> If you do not have a printer, see instruction below.

- ✓ The training takes 55 minutes to complete and is the only training that will fulfill the requirement for safe environment training for adults working with children and youth in the Diocese of Erie. Training is best viewed using the Chrome or Edge browser.
- Please have a hard copy of the diocesan *Policy for the Protection of Children* available for reference as you move through the training.

- There is a quiz at the conclusion of the training. A score of 80% must be achieved to print your certificate. If you fail to pass the quiz, you must repeat the training. Once the quiz is completed and passed, there will be boxes for the participants to enter their name and parish/school/agency. A certificate must then be printed. If you do not have a printer, take a screenshot of the completed certificate, or snip the completed certificate and email the screenshot to the Child Protection office. The screenshot must include the website location, date, and time stamp (do not crop).
- ✓ Print **TWO** copies of your certificate. Give one to your supervisor in the parish/school/agency for inclusion in your personnel file and keep one for your own file. Priests, Deacons and Saint Mark Catholic Center employees must send a copy of their certificate to the Office for the Protection of Children and Youth for inclusion in their personnel files.
