A Difficult Time at the Medical Dispensary

Dengue is a tropical disease typically spread by mosquitos. Lately, there has been a very high incidence of Dengue cases in Mérida area. Thus, the Mission of Friendship medical dispensary has been very busy providing the necessary support to our community. Most of these Dengue cases started in late August and continued through the month of September.

During these few months, the number of people coming to the dispensary with this disease increased significantly, as multiple members within the same family became ill. In addition to a medical consultation, the families were provided with follow-up until full recovery. The follow up involved frequent extra consultations, referrals for blood tests to assess improvement in platelet numbers, and notes for school to explain absences. The patients were also monitored and advised by Dr. Silvia on when it was safe to resume their usual activities.

Dr. Silvia also made use of WhatsApp messages to answer patients' questions and give them peace of mind as they recovered from this virus. Through this WhatsApp tool, Dr. Silvia was able to quickly advise patients how to respond to complications anytime day or night.

Public hospitals were saturated and did not accept patients unless they were bleeding – thus Dr. Silvia's efforts were so important. Necessary medications were sold out in many places, especially pharmacies in the south of the city. For that reason, Dr. Silvia had to buy medicines from the pharmacies in the north of the city, to help with the shortages in the Medical Dispensary (which is in the South of Merida city). We are grateful to Dr. Silvia for her efforts to help so many people during this difficult time!

In June of 2022 I started English classes thanks to the Mission of Friendship program. Since then, I have been studying the language every Saturday afternoon. I would like to express my gratitude for this chance to take the classes and learn, since I truly think that this opportunity will allow me to provide a better support to the Mission of Friendship in the future.

 I'm aware that it won't overnight, and that learning a new language takes a lot of practice. The teachers tell us that we must practice at home, so although the classes are once a week, I practice all week long by watching movies in English and by reading in English. I also practice translating Spanish texts into English.



All of this has been a great learning experience. Now, my classes have advanced to the public speaking part. We have only done two speeches so far, and the first time I was a little embarrassed to talk about the topic; my speech was about a horror movie. I know that my diction is not yet perfect, but the speech was only for the classroom. These experiences have helped me to learn proper English diction and pronunciation.

On September 15, my classmates and I did a demonstration of typical Mexican dishes. I practiced a lot to be able to give an adequate explanation and I was able to improve my speaking. Each student had to talk about a typical Mexican dish, snack, or sweets. I talked about flautas.

The process of learning grammar is particularly challenging to me. The rules of how sentences are formed, and how to make the present, past or future tenses is still tough for me. My goal is to be able to understand and speak English. I'm not at 100% yet, but little by little I'm learning to communicate in this new language!

Hello, my name is Jhoana Jossette Leon Perera. I am 24 years old and I just graduated with my bachelor's degree in nursing thanks to a lot of work, and the support of my sponsors from the Diocese of Erie.

When I found out that I had been admitted to the Nursing Program at the Autonomous University of Yucatán, I thought it would be an enormous challenge because, despite being a public university, nursing is a very expensive course of study. This was a great concern to me and my family, but my desire to study, improve myself, and build a better future was even greater.

Early on, some friends recommended to us this great and generous Amigos Program that benefited me a lot and was an enormous help. Since my family has limited resources, the Amigos Program greatly reduced my mother's financial concerns as I attended university.



The financial support I received from my sponsors was used for

transportation and school supplies, in addition to books and uniforms. Having this support motivated me to get good grades, learn everything that the teachers taught about my (future) profession, to be a good professional and not disappoint the people who were (and are still) my support. Even now that I have finished school, my sponsors helped me with the payment of my title and professional license. I truly hope that they are proud of my achievement, because in fact it is also theirs.

The nursing program required four long years of studies and hospital internships, where my sponsors and the Amigos Program were attentive to me month after month. Even during the pandemic, they did not stop supporting me in significant ways. To me they were the light that illuminated my nights of study and sleeplessness, and day after day they motivated me to be better and work hard in school.

The last year of my studies I carried out my internship at the New Maternal and Child Hospital, which is located an hour away from my house by public transportation. It was a challenging year, but it was a year full of knowledge and experience because I put into practice everything I learned.

Now that I have completed my bachelor's degree, my interest is to continue to stay up to speed with the latest in nursing with short courses, and to study the specialty of surgical nursing, which I think I can afford with the job I do.
