

From “*ANTIQUUM MINISTERIUM*” – *INSTITUTING THE MINISTRY OF CATECHIST*
by Pope Francis

6. The role played by catechists is one specific form of service among others within the Christian community. Catechists are called first to be expert in the pastoral service of transmitting the faith as it develops through its different stages from the initial proclamation of the *kerygma* to the instruction that presents our new life in Christ and prepares for the sacraments of Christian initiation, and then to the ongoing formation that can allow each person to give an accounting of the hope within them (cf. *1 Pet* 3:15). At the same time, every catechist must be a witness to the faith, a teacher and mystagogue, a companion and pedagogue, who teaches for the Church. Only through prayer, study, and direct participation in the life of the community can they grow in this identity and the integrity and responsibility that it entails (cf. Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization, *Directory for Catechesis*, 113).

8. It is fitting that those called to the instituted ministry of Catechist be men and women of deep faith and human maturity, active participants in the life of the Christian community, capable of welcoming others, being generous and living a life of fraternal communion. They should also receive suitable biblical, theological, pastoral and pedagogical formation to be competent communicators of the truth of the faith and they should have some prior experience of catechesis (cf. SECOND VATICAN ECUMENICAL COUNCIL, Decree on the Pastoral Office of Bishops in the Church *Christus Dominus*, 14; CIC can. 231 §1; CCEO can. 409 §1). It is essential that they be faithful co-workers with priests and deacons, prepared to exercise their ministry wherever it may prove necessary, and motivated by true apostolic enthusiasm.

The Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments will publish a Rite of Institution of the new lay ministry of catechist.

Certifying Your Catechists

There are just some of the certification programs recommended for catechists. These are many online courses available. Please check with the Office of Faith Formation for suitability of a course or program before beginning it. This gives you a brief summary of each, including cost.

Aquinas College in Nashville

Cost is FREE.

Aquinas College and the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia have created videos to help people understand their Catholic Faith deeper and as part of the Catechist Formation Program. They are also a great refresher if you have taken any of the Catechist Formation courses in the past or any adult who wants to learn more about their Catholic Faith.

There are 6 Courses to the Catechist Formation Program, each containing the 5 areas of: Creed, Sacraments, Morality, Prayer, and Methods. Any formal use of these videos may only be used with written permission from Aquinas College. Please contact [Sister Elizabeth Anne](#) for more information.

This curriculum is based on and follows the Catechism's own pedagogy and emphasizes the unity of the Catholic Faith. What we believe as Catholics is expressed in the Creed, celebrated in the Sacraments, lived in the moral life, and prayed. It is important to remember that this formation in the Church's doctrine is an essential part of any formation as a catechist, but it is only one

Echoes of Faith

Two versions of this program. The newest version is the Emmaus version:

<https://www.rclbenziger.com/Echoes-Emmaus> The cost is \$50 for a one-year license or the earlier version, which is 3.0 version for \$34.95 for a one-year license. Catechists can take as many courses as they like over the one-year license period.

Two classes are needed for basic certification, then three additional for Intermediate and three more for the Certified Catechist level. (see chart)

Franciscan At Home: from Franciscan University of Steubenville:

The Catechetical Institute of FUS has a \$400 per parish per year for unlimited number of catechists. This fee entitles anyone in your parish to access the training for all of the ministries. However, no certificate is issued. There is also a choice for a \$12.99/month for individual subscription that

gives you access to the mentors of the Catechetical Institute and a certificate from them when you complete a training track.

The Diocese of Erie is currently considering becoming a partner diocese, which would enable all people in our diocese to earn a certificate in ministry at no cost. If this moves forward, details will be forthcoming in the Spring of 2025.

These other options are for more catechist education. This site also includes: the Foundations Series. The Foundations Series presents the teachings of the faith in an interactive format which draws heavily from Scripture and the Catechism. This course makes it easy to learn and understand the four Pillars of Church: Creed, Liturgy and Sacraments, Life in Christ, and Prayer. Mike Scherschligt, the founder and executive director of the Holy Family School of Faith, engages the learner with videos, stories, analogies, prayers, and discussion questions. All four Foundations courses are available for \$80 for a one-year subscription (36 lessons) or individually at \$33 for each course. Completion of the four pillars results in Certified Catechist.
