

From "ANTIQUUM MINISTERIUM" – INSTITUTING THE MINISTRY OF CATECHIST by Pope Francis

6. The role played by catechists is one specific form of service among others within the Christian community. Catechists are called first to be expert in the pastoral service of transmitting the faith as it develops through its different stages from the initial proclamation of the *kerygma* to the instruction that presents our new life in Christ and prepares for the sacraments of Christian initiation, and then to the ongoing formation that can allow each person to give an accounting of the hope within them (cf. *1 Pet* 3:15). At the same time, every catechist must be a witness to the faith, a teacher and mystagogue, a companion and pedagogue, who teaches for the Church. Only through prayer, study, and direct participation in the life of the community can they grow in this identity and the integrity and responsibility that it entails (cf. Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization, *Directory for Catechesis*, 113).

8. It is fitting that those called to the instituted ministry of Catechist be men and women of deep faith and human maturity, active participants in the life of the Christian community, capable of welcoming others, being generous and living a life of fraternal communion. They should also receive suitable biblical, theological, pastoral and pedagogical formation to be competent communicators of the truth of the faith and they should have some prior experience of catechesis (cf. SECOND VATICAN ECUMENICAL COUNCIL, Decree on the Pastoral Office of Bishops in the Church *Christus Dominus*, 14; CIC can. 231 §1; CCEO can. 409 §1). It is essential that they be faithful co-workers with priests and deacons, prepared to exercise their ministry wherever it may prove necessary, and motivated by true apostolic enthusiasm.

The Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments will publish a Rite of Institution of the new lay ministry of catechist.

These other options are for more catechist education. This site includes: Foundations Series
 The Foundations Series presents the teachings of the faith in an interactive format which draws heavily from Scripture and the Catechism. This course makes it easy to learn and understand the four Pillars of Church: Creed, Liturgy and Sacraments, Life in Christ, and Prayer. Mike Scherschligt, the founder and executive director of the Holy Family School of Faith, engages the learner with videos, stories, analogies, prayers, and discussion questions. All four Foundations courses are available for \$80 for a one-year subscription (36 lessons) or individually at \$33 for each course. Completion of the four pillars results in Certified Catechist.

Echoes of Faith

Two versions of this program. The newest version is the Emmaus version:

Two classes are needed for basic certification, then three additional for Intermediate and three more for the Certified Catechist level. (see chart)

Aquinas College in Nashville

Cost is \$25 per course. There are six courses. Each course takes approximately 10-12 hours to complete. Each lesson consists of watching a video lecture and taking a short quiz.

You will have 120 days to complete this course.

Acceptable for basic and intermediate certification. Cost is \$33 for a one-year subscription for eight lessons. Franciscan At Home: from Franciscan University of Steubenville:

Cost is \$300 per parish per year for unlimited number of catechists, or \$12.99/month for individual subscriptions. The less expensive option of \$4.99/month gives you access to the classes, but does not provide evidence you have completed the course.

Directed to any person engaged in teaching ministries at any level, this three-part comprehensive program offers spiritual, methodological, philosophical, and doctrinal topics essential to the teaching of the Catholic faith. Believing that the most significant factor in the catechetical endeavor is the individual catechist passing on the witness of a lived faith, this track aims to complement basic diocesan catechist certification. It does this by enriching in-diocese teaching with workshops designed to: 1) Take catechists to the next step of formation in key areas; 2) Address target areas needing strengthening in our current cultural context; and 3) Enable catechists to continue growing their skills and understanding in the years following completion of diocesan certification.
