# **Grade Three**

## I. Goal

To introduce the children to the fact that God has a Church to help transform the world.

## II. Objectives

Message The students will:

- 1. Define the Kingdom of God as the effect of the power of God's life and love in the world. ( 541-560 )
- 2. Define that a creed is a summary of beliefs. (26)
- 3. State that the Apostles'/Nicene Creeds are the basic creeds of the Catholic community. (185-197)
- 4. Examine the basic tenets of the creed. (54-276)
- 5. Describe the four marks of the Catholic Church. (172-175; 811-865)
- 6. Say the Apostles' Creed from memory. (Page 49)
- 7. Say the Two Great Commandments from memory. (2055; 2083)
- 8. Define the Ten Commandments as laws or rules given by God to help them live good lives. (2052-2074; 2084-2550)
- 9. Describe the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy as Catholic guidelines for their spiritual life. (1803-1832; 2443-2449)
- 10. Identify the Sacraments of Initiation, the Sacraments of Healing, and the Sacraments of Vocation. (1212; 1421; 1534)
- Characterize the Church as a group of people who preach God's word, build community, worship God, and serve all people. (103; 791; 949-953; 1066-1075; 1877-1942)
- 12. State that the Church is a praying community supported by personal prayer. (2566-2567; 2623-2643)
- 13. Describe the Church as the People of God led by professional ministers: ordained, consecrated and lay. (668-670; 770-835; 871-933; 1140-1144)

- 14. Explain that the Pope is the Bishop of Rome and the head of the Catholic Church. (880-887)
- 15. Explain that the Bishop is the head of the local Church (diocese) and that his ministry is supported by priests, deacons, religious and lay ministers. (888-899)
- 16. Describe the Church as the People of God, each member using their gifts and talents in service to the Church and world (ministry). (748-801)
- 17. Define the terms listed for grade three on page 37.
- 18. Tell Bible Stories in a manner appropriate to their age. (See page 59-60)

#### **Worship** The students will:

1. Practice a variety of prayer forms guided by Catholic Tradition, e.g., (for example) (2567; 2644; 2660; 2684; 2685)

Memorized (2688) Song (1156-1158;2663) Dance and role play (2663) Gestures (2663) Rosary (971;2678;2708)

Silence (2709-2724) Spontaneous (2700-2701) Guided images (2705-2708) Scriptural/story (2653-2654)

- 2. Participate in celebrations of the liturgical year, i.e. (that is) Sunday Mass ( Liturgy ) (2174-2188 ) Holy Days (2042-2043; 2180 ) Special feasts/saints/Marian feasts (484-507; 963-972; 2673-2679 )
- 3. Participate in a retreat. (one-half day experience) (2691)
- 4. Experience the enthronement of the Bible at the beginning of the catechetical year and maintain the presence of the Scripture in a prominent place during every catechetical session. (102-103; 131-133)
- 5. Plan and participate in a Eucharistic Celebration. (1348-1355)
- 6. Participate in a Penance service with the opportunity for individual Reconciliation.

**Community** The students will:

- 1. Be given family take-home material to encourage the domestic church. (2204; 2694)
- 2. Celebrate the parish patron saint's feast day in an age appropriate way. (946-958; 2157)
- 3. Participate in several organized events that promote social and community interaction, e.g.,
  Skating Party Field Day
  Picnic (Family) Bike Rides
  Christmas Caroling Sled Rides
  Party/pageant/drama based on the liturgical year
  Intergenerational (older student/teen/grandparent) Activities
- 4. Demonstrate that sharing non-threatening areas of their lives is an essential part of Christian Community.

**Service** The students will:

- Demonstrate that service is essential for the Christian life by (544; 2044-2046)
- Participating in several service opportunities in the parish (involving families when possible, (1716-1729; 1822-1829), e.g., Cards for appropriate occasions and parish needs Food/clothing collection and distribution Recycling/environmental clean-up Visit nursing homes, shut-ins
- 2. Participating in service opportunities promoting global awareness, (1886-1889; 1905-1917; 1928-1942) e.g., Rice Bowl Bread for the World Holy Childhood Association Crop Walk Mission Activity Hunger Meal SOME (So that Others May Eat)
- 3. Exploring that service can be a career, e.g., Field trip to or visitors from: Police/fire department Convent/rectory Nursing home Soup kitchen Health fields Religious Education Leaders
- 4. Discussing the meaning that they derived from their service project(s).

# III. Content

- 1. The Apostles'/Nicene Creeds are the basic summary of beliefs of the Catholic community.
- 2. The Ten Commandments were given by God to guide people in living good lives.
- 3. The Sacraments of Initiation, Healing, Vocation.
- 4. The Church, the Body of Christ, preaches God's word, builds community, worships God and serves all people (Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy).
- 5. The Church, led by ordained and lay ministers, is made up of God's people who use their gifts and talents for the Church and world.

### **IV.** Outcomes and Evaluation

#### **Knowledge** Do the students know:

- 1. The definition of the Kingdom of God?
- 2. The definition of the word creed and that the Apostles' Nicene Creeds are the essential creeds of the Catholic Church?
- 3. The four marks of the Church?
- 4. The Apostles' Creed and the Two Great Commandments from memory?
- 5. The Ten Commandments are rules given by God to help them live good lives?
- 6. The Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy are Catholic guidelines for their spiritual life?
- 7. The Sacraments of Initiation, Healing and Vocation?
- 8. The Church is the People of God who prays, preaches God's word, builds community, and serves others?
- 9. The roles of the Pope and a bishop?
- 10. The name of the current pope, their current bishop, and their pastor?

#### Attitudes and Beliefs

Do the students:

- 1. Feel that God loves them personally?
- 2. Have an attitude of reverence for the Bible?
- 3. Sense that they belong to the worldwide Catholic Church?
- 4. Believe that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is important to their lives?
- 5. Believe that Eucharist is a way of life?
- 6. View the Church as having a purpose to help change the world?
- 7. Realize that each member has a responsibility for the work of the Church?
- 8. Believe that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is important to their lives?
- 9. Realize the importance of personal sharing for the development of community?

#### **Behavior** How do the students:

- 1. Pray as a part of their daily life?
- 2. Responsibly participate in all class activities including worship, service and social functions?
- 3. Share the take-home material with their families?
- 4. Participate regularly in the Eucharist?
- 5. Exhibit the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy in their daily lives?
