Chastity Education Program Overview 5th through 8th grade

As supportive partners of parents, the Diocese of Erie Catholic Schools will provide a Chastity Education Program for all 5th through 8th grade students. Parents who do not wish to have their child participate must notify the principal in writing to have them excused from this curriculum. Five lessons will be provided to the 5th and 6th graders. At the 7th and 8th grade level, students will have ten lessons from *Love & Life, A Christian Sexual Morality Guide for Teens* by Coleen Kelly Mast. This program has been approved by Bishop Lawrence T. Persico for its alignment with Catholic Doctrine and Diocesan Curriculum Guidelines.

Chastity leaves us free to answer God's call. The sacrament of Matrimony is a lifelong commitment. Sexual union has a God-given purpose. God is pro-life and pro-love. God challenges us to live this life of love. What is the call to chastity?
