MANY ARE THE PLANS By: Thomas Braeger

"Many are the plans in a man's heart, but the Lord directs his steps."

In 2018 my life took an unimaginable turn as my wife of 30 years, Analida, was diagnosed with inoperable and incurable brain cancer. This was the darkest and most difficult time I have ever faced, and at the same time, the power of God has come into my life and the Holy Spirit has completely transformed me.

In 2018, we were both in our early fifties and had day jobs and an online business that gave us the flexibility to work remotely from anywhere. We started making plans for our 'semi-retirement,' to include traveling overseas to do ministry work or God's work while working remotely.

In June of 2018, we traveled to Ireland on a tour for our 30th wedding anniversary. After this trip, Ana started to get dizzy and fell a couple times. Very concerned, I drove her to the ER at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center hospital in Pittsburgh. We needed answers.

At the hospital, scans found a brain tumor. Time seemed to freeze upon hearing these words. How was this possible? She was admitted and I stayed in the room with her. I stepped into a private lounge while she was sleeping in the ICU and I proceeded to make very tearful calls to our two children and to Ana's family in Panama. My son Adam was home working, but my daughter, Erika, was working in Vietnam at the time. She immediately packed up and moved home.

With each call I made I was more drained emotionally and could barely make the next call. While on the phone I was crying out to God. "How this could be happening to us? This was not supposed to happen. Why? We had plans to do Your work overseas and doing ministry work." A biopsy came back as cancer in the brain stem. Me being me, I raced into research and discovered that what she, we, were facing was **inoperable**, **incurable brain cancer** with about a 3% chance of 5 year survival and likely 18 months. I never told her this. We just went into battle mode, whatever it took we would face it together. It was in God's hands and we had to trust Him, regardless of the outcome.

Ana rapidly deteriorated to 89 pounds at 5' 2" (from 130ish pounds), and at one point, she became unresponsive. This was terrifying. They did another MRI. I got a call. Her doctors did not think she was going to make through the night because the pressure in her brain was growing. They wanted to do surgery to relieve the pressure - and I had to make a decision - but surgery would delay the start of chemotherapy and radiation treatment by about 6 weeks.

I said, "No surgery," since I believed she could not survive it at 89 pounds. How could she muster the strength to heal? She had declined so much in just one week how could she wait 6 more weeks for treatment?

I was desperate for God to save her. I knew Our Lady of Lourdes could intercede for miracles for those who were sick so I got on the Lourdes website and found a place to submit a request that would be printed and taken to the grotto of Our Lady. I was crying out to God, not wanting this to be the end. I wept all night and prayed to Our Lady for her intercession to save Ana. She made it through the night. When her doctor visited our room the next day he described her survival as a miracle. She then began hospitalized for radiation and chemo and the fight for her life. I prayed my rosary each day to Our Lady that She would intercede for Ana's healing and to give all of us strength to care for her at home. As we continued to pray each day, we were given two additional and precious years as a gift from God. I can't imagine us fighting cancer without our faith. The Holy Spirit carried us.

Ana was called home at only 55 years of age. Now began a period of deep heartache and grieving. Everything felt completely *different*. I was her husband for 32 years. That was the life I knew. And now I was alone. I had to trust the Lord to lead me. It is in the most difficult trials of our lives that the outpouring of God's grace is the strongest if our hearts are open to receive it. This openness comes from the Holy Spirit.

I had no idea how to navigate this new and different life. God had just carried me through the fight of my life. I still felt His grace each day, but I was confused and needed HIS direction. For this, I had to step back and let Him show me a bigger picture. One thing the Lord revealed to me early on was that I needed to write down my story to share with others. Others need to know this grace is available to them if they just open their hearts to receive it. In fact, I was bursting to tell this story of love and grace and could not hold my story in. It was burning inside me of Jeremiah when he says in verse 20:9

"But *if* I say, 'I will not remember Him Nor speak anymore in His name,' Then in my heart it becomes like a burning fire Shut up in my bones; And I am tired of holding *it* in, And I cannot endure *it*." Jeremiah 20:9. NASB

I felt this new and multiplied powerful flow of grace in my life... and I wanted more. **Much more!** I wanted it for others as well. In response, I was trying to live a fast-forward mode that is hard to describe. It was like I was in a race for more grace. I have always been a 'type-A' person with a desire to go after things with gusto and vigor, so during my new experiences with the Holy Spirit, I was no different as I was being set on fire. But in doing this, at times, I was running

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ahead of God. But as I continued to be open, the Holy Spirit knew exactly where to lead me. I was led to Faith On Fire! CCRC (formerly Word Of Life). I felt like these people somehow understood what I was going through spiritually and I wanted what they had!

Learning about the role of the Holy Spirit through Faith On Fire! had an immediate spiritual and life-changing impact. It also allowed me to use my God-given talents within an incredible evangelistic ministry. However, in my own will, I continued to pile other various ministries on my plate while my mind raced to think of what additional work I could do in the Lord's vineyard. It would be accurate to say that I had the gas pedal punched to the floor with very little steering. Then came my

Baptism in the Holy Spirit.

Not long before my baptism in the Holy Spirit I was prayed over at a prayer group meeting during 'The Gift' Life In The Spirit Seminar. Both experiences were completely new. I physically felt the spiritual power of God and great peace. I was given a word from the Lord to "stop striving and just receive" while they were praying. When I just relaxed and ceased striving, the physical and spiritual calm that came over me felt almost like floating and lasted well into the next days. Words from the Holy Spirit started to come to me: "Slow down and live in the moment." Our risen Lord gave the greeting, "Peace be with you." These words now had a whole new experiential meaning to me. I knew the Lord was telling me

that I needed to slow down, get out of the way, and take time to listen to Him.

EXORCIST DIARY #175 - DEMONS FROM TV By: Msgr. Stephen Rossetti

Our Team has exorcized a number of houses, rectories, schools, and church buildings. One of the Team members present is usually a gifted spiritual sensitive. Such people can often tell us where the demons are located, what kind of evil spirits they are, and perhaps when they are cast out.

Invariably, demons will be concentrated in areas where sinful, and especially occult, behavior have taken place. For example, we found demons in known places of illicit sex. We found a demon in the office of a practitioner of Reiki. A possessed person had several in her work space. The worst was an area where occult rituals had been performed and religious statues defaced: it was totally infested!

After doing these exorcisms of a place for some years, I noticed a pattern. In places where there were televisions, regardless of which spiritual sensitive was present, he or she always noted a demon on the main chair in front of the TV. Sometimes I knew the individuals involved in that place and I do not think the majority of them were watching pornography or explicitly sinful material. Why then was there almost invariably a demon in that place?

Upon reflection, what we are viewing on our screens today, and what society considers "normal," is often sexually arousing and filled with violence. What was considered objectionable only a few decades ago is now considered acceptable for daily viewing. Our society may not consider such material as an opening to evil, but apparently demons do!

Watching such material will not likely result in someone getting possessed, but it will invite demons into one's home. And the stronger the demons present, the more chaos, conflict and temptations they will sow. The consistent presence of demons in front of televisions ought to make us more conscious and vigilant about what we watch. There are some fine shows on television, but there are many others that are not.

Rather than opening the door to demons by watching such degrading shows, why not recite in our living rooms the daily family rosary instead? Thus, we invite into our homes the Blessed Virgin and her beautiful angels.

No matter how old I get, I constantly struggle with the question, "What is God's will for me?" It is easy for me to look at others and see that they are following Him and growing in His love and wisdom. Why can't I see what is happening in my own life? As I pondered this issue I remembered my childhood encounter with the Baltimore Catechism. It was our childhood bible. We worked through the questions and memorized the answers. One question is permanently written in my brain. When I prayed about God's will for me, that question and answer were right there all along from that beloved Baltimore Catechism.

Why did God make me?

To know Him, to love Him and to serve Him in this world and be with Him in the next.

So how do I know God?

By reading His word and connecting with Him in prayer.

How do I love God?

By praising Him in prayer and song, and thanking Him for His love.

How do I serve God?

By bringing His love to every person, or even animal, that He has brought into my life and by using the gifts He has given me to bring His truth and love to others.

Finally, how will I get to be with Him in Heaven? By practicing the above.

I just realized as I reviewed the question, that I have to *work the list* if I want to realize the end result. It will not happen automatically.

So here I am, and I am in the situation I am in because this is God's will for me. I need to stop beating myself up, and instead, see my daily challenges as an opportunity for blessings. It is not by the world's standards that God will judge my successes, but by His.

It is my choice how I live my daily challenges and that will determine my soul's final destination.

- Am I kind to my family members who try my patience?
- Am I am forgiving of the daily irritations that come with interacting with close family members?
- Have I forgiven the things that have been said that hurt my feelings?

- Do I perform my daily chores with love or with resentment?
- Do I use my time wisely or wastefully?
- Do I give the beginning and end of each day to the Lord in prayer?

When I review each day, I must remember that the next day I need to try again, to do better and try harder with the assistance of the Holy Spirit. God will be there as I persevere.

I recently listened to a teaching about St. Therese of Lisieux. I realized that I could identify with her. She longed to be a Saint, and when she compared herself to known Saints, she felt inferior and discouraged. I struggle to be good Christian, not even thinking of Sainthood. I feel inferior as I compare myself to others I know who have overcome many challenges and difficulties with grace and love.

St. Therese wrote about this spiritual pathway in her autobiography: **Story of a Soul**. As she prayed she realized that she could only do the best she could in any given situation. She came to understand that *this is all God asks of any of us*. She compared our spiritual journey to a child learning to walk. The infant takes a step and falls. As long as the child keeps getting up and trying, God will bless the attempts and the child will ultimately begin walking.

So isn't my original question the same as Therese's 'Little Way'? She worked at knowing God, loving God, and serving Him. She did each little thing well, not worrying about doing 'big things.' And THAT is why she is now with Him in Heaven.

The world's view of success in not God's view. On judgment day, he will not look at my financial net worth, possessions, academic degrees, or followers on social media. My life review will be measured in Love degrees: How much I loved each day, in every way. St Therese of Lisieux reminds me (and you) that:

"Love can accomplish all things. Things that are most impossible become easy where love is at work."

and

"Our Lord does not so much look at the greatness of our actions, or even at their difficulty, as at the love with which we do them."

The Rosary

The rosary itself is composed of 60 beads laced together with a crucifix and a pendant of Mary where the 3 strands meet. We divide the Rosary into 6 segments. The 1st segment is composed of the introductory prayers and that is followed by 5 decades.

The Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.



Introductory Prayers: The Apostles' Creed / Our Father

The Apostles' Creed:

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the God the Father Almighty; from there he will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be

Our Father

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Intentions

After the introductory prayers and before the mystery is announced the leader of the group may announce an intention for this particular decade. The intention may be a person by name, a group of persons, a prayer for peace and justice, or some other worthy cause, or a prayer for the deceased. Next, the leader will announce the mystery, for example, "The first sorrowful mystery is the agony in the garden." All twenty mysteries of the 4Rosary will follow the same three-step pattern, scripture, reflection and personal experience.

Hail Holy Queen

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve: to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, O most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary! Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.
