## PRAYER IS A REAL LOVE GIFT By: Katheryn Wilcox

Love is in the air, especially in February with hearts and flowers decorating the St. Valentine's Day cards that make Hallmark coffers swell with cash!

When you consider all the options you have to remind your loved ones that you love them, why not just send the card and forsake the candy and flowers and pray for them? Or do both? Some we know are easy to pray for, others not so much. And sometimes we are tempted to think I that our prayers are in vain. How can we *know* our prayers are doing any good, especially for those who don't ask or even want our prayers??? Or when we don't see the evidence that they are doing good?

It is estimated that prayer is mentioned in the bible at least 650 times, and out of that number over 450 refer to answered prayers. Wow! So, if we believe the bible, God does answer prayer.. Here are just a few scriptures affirming that:

#### Mark 11:24 (NABRE):

"Therefore I tell you, all that you ask for in prayer, believe that you will receive it and it shall be yours."

Prayers that are never uttered cannot be answered, so we must ask to receive answers. We are Charismatic, so we have the gift of tongues!! Pray, Pray, Pray!!!! If you don't have that gift, it's not a requirement for ANSWERED prayers! Pray, pray, pray.

#### Romans 12:12 (NABRE):

"Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, persevere in prayer."

Laziness is not productive, especially in our spiritual life. St Monica prayed for at least 20 years for her son, Saint Augustine, and other non- Christian family members. Because of her prayers and good example, her mother- in- law was converted at the end of her life. And finally... Monica's son St Augustine, the intellectual, was powerfully converted and, after his death, was proclaimed a Saint and one of the few and great doctors of the church.

Scripture even gives an example of someone who was healed personally by Jesus, yet there is no explanation that gives the man's name or his request for prayer. He was a paralytic who was lowered through the roof of a building where Jesus was teaching because his friends could not get him through the door? He was healed because he and his friends had two things... faith and persistence!

#### Mark 2:4-5 (NABRE).

"Unable to get near Jesus because of the crowd, they opened up the roof above him. After they had broken through, they let down the mat on which the paralytic was lying. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, "Child, your sins are forgiven."

This amazing scripture tells us that the man was healed and his sins forgiven because of the faith of him and his friends!!!! He couldn't go himself, but his friends who loved him and wanted to see him healed, took him. Imagine... They got there and the crowd was so dense that they couldn't get their friend to Jesus. Did that stop them? No! They were so intent on seeing their friend healed and so confident that Jesus would heal him that they cut a hole in the roof of the person's house and lowered him down through the ceiling above Jesus.

How much faith (and love) for people who need healing to *you* have? I doubt that any of us would cut a hole in someone's roof to get them to a Healing Mass. Thank God we don't need to. But do you pray *persistently* for them and

would you offer to pick them up for a Healing Mass? We have had many testimonies of miraculous healing from attending a Healing Mass.

#### Mark 16:18 (BLT)

"...they will lay their hands on the sick, and they will be made well."

So, will God answer our prayers for our loved ones and friends? Yes, if we are asking for the right things- conversion, healing, and God's will above all else, and offering out of a heart of love and concern.

Love and prayer move the heart of God. The people who need our prayers may not even ask for pray, be believers, or be convinced that it will work. It is OUR faith and perseverance (in love) that will bring our Lord and *His love* and healing into the lives of our family and friends.

What happens when we offer the gift of prayer? God hears and God answers. Amen!

## 'TRADITIONAL' CATHOLICS - I SAY YES! AND AMEN! By Jaci Phillips-Sabol, PhD

A friend recently told me that, at a particular apparition site of the Blessed Mother, She is calling us to 'get back to the roots of our faith.' I couldn't agree more. What do you picture when you hear these words? When I hear or read something about 'getting back to our traditional Catholic roots,' I do not picture the Latin Mass (valid and beautiful as it is, and it is) or beautiful statues that call to mind role models; part of the 'great cloud of witnesses. While I was in Texas, the reverence of wearing a veil became dear to my heart. I love wearing my veil when I go to meet my Bridegroom. It is a gesture of intimacy with my Beloved, but I don't think that every woman is called to veil. However, being called to reverence is a different story. Reverence is born out of awe. And that has declined dramatically.

For me, our 'traditional Catholic roots' does not call to mind obligatory fasting, yet at the same time, most of us do not understand the incredible power and value of fasting, primarily because the value is not taught. Things have become watered down, in some respects stripping away a depth and power of practices that are of great spiritual benefit. But these are not the things that come to my mind. If we are to get back to 'our Catholic roots,' I say, "Amen." But which roots? Because only going way WAY back to the earliest roots can purify or heal; only one thing can assist you or me or any ordained person in the Church: a return to the promise of Jesus; what HE rooted us in.

Don't speak to me about a Latin Mass that is beautiful and reverent and holy (truly, it is), if you are filled with rigidity and self-righteous judgment, or if you think that holiness is being able to quote the entire Catechism of the Catholic Church, -but the Bible? - not so much. Or if you think that mindless recitation of prayers will get you into heaven. Praying is good, but we must have our life and heart centered on Jesus, as the Blessed Mother did. The whole point of the rosary was so that us 'simple' faithful could meditate on the life of Christ. Many people are not aware that meditating on the mysteries is the point of the rosary. If we recite it in "vain repetition, as the pagans do" (Mt 6:7, BLT), then Jesus warned against it. A better translation of

this verse is "to babble" or "heap up empty phrases" (Mt 6:7, RSV).

Not all repetition is vain if it is *from the heart* or if it is *persistent*. Let us recall that "Jesus prayed three times" (Mt 26:44) and praised the persistence of the Canaanite requesting the scraps that fall from the table (Mt 15:27-28). Israel and all the host of Heaven cry out three times, "Holy! Holy! Holy!" There are times when I am so filled with awe of God that all my lips can utter is "Holy, Holy, Holy..." over and over and over. We must strive (imperfectly at times) to be *present* during our prayers, not *mindless*.

If you love the 'personal'-ness of the Novus Ordo (Mass in your language) but have lost almost all reverence for the Son of God who remains constantly present within the tabernacle, then you also need to turn back your Catholic clock. Anyone of us who is a pew warmer at Sunday Mass, without it ever changing our hearts or without seeing the true mystical nature of the Mass ("This IS My Body") needs a return to the roots of our faith. Anyone who doesn't know Jesus as a personal Savior, complete with a personal relationship, needs a return to the things that made the early Christians so *capable*. This relationship is recognized in a way that just can't be explained until you have truly experienced that JESUS IS ALIVE!

WE ALL NEED A RETURN TO OUR EARLIEST ROOTS. These roots create both miracles and Saints. We marvel at Saints throughout history who bilocated to places they were needed yet remained where they were. Many of us cannot comprehend ecstasies of Saints like Catherine of Sienna or Theresa of Avila. We have a holy envy of Saint Faustina's conversations with Jesus. My friend, Pachi Talbot, a visionary from Ecuador, has seen the Blessed Mother for 30 years and I confess a holy envy of her. Saint John had a vision in which he was taken into heaven before the very throne of Jesus and the Living God... we call it the book of Revelation. Saint Philip the Apostle was transported from one place to another, 30 miles away as soon as he baptized the eunuch. The early believers had all things in common (shared all things) and they were 'all in one accord,' i.e., they were in agreement on matters of faith and lived peacefully with each other. And it was (is) all possible because they were (are) all very traditional Catholics. These roots give us the ability to "love the Lord [our] God with all [our] heart, mind, soul, and strength" and to "love [our] neighbor as ourselves." So please, let us return the traditional roots of the Church; the ones that existed before a word of the New Testament was written.

I am of the opinion, and you are free to disagree, but the last 6 Popes also agree, that the whole of the Catholic Church (and every other Christian church); every priest (pastor), deacon, bishop, nun, Cardinal, and layperson, (did I leave anyone out?) should long for the only roots capable of uniting the Body of Christ and of returning the Church to Her intended full glory as the pure and spotless bride of Christ.

These power-packed traditional roots are able to deliver us from the "things that defile a man's heart" (Mt 15:19-20). Let the whole Body of Christ cry out for what has the power to both convict of sin ("I now rejoice... that you were made sorrowful to the point of repentance" 2 Cor 7:9, NASB) while making us capable of fleeing from sin and living a sanctified and holy life; producing both that Godly sorrow that helps us to overcome our sin and "the peace of the Lord that surpasses understanding" (Phil 4:7, ESV).

And let's not forget that traditional document that keeps us from following the false teachers and "doctrines of demons" (1 Tim 4:1-2) that so concerned both Jesus and Paul. Maybe they were referring to the heretical fluff gospel, which molds itself to the world while accepting almost nothing as being sinful and never calls anyone to growth, or the self-centered gospel that keeps us seeking only after consolations and the fantastic gifts of the Holy Spirit (which are, by the way incredible and NECESSARY) without ever coming to the realization that we have a sinful nature that needs to be dealt with in a forthright manner; ... or the powerless gospel that sees no miracles and completely fails to preach that we were meant to walk in a balance of the power of the Gifts of the Spirit while cultivating the Fruit of the Spirit.

## HERE I GO...OUT OF THE BOAT! By Kathy Wilcox

Last month I wrote about the New Years' prophesy: "Walk on Water." This month the Lord called me to "Get out of the Boat." I got a phone call from my friend of 48 years. She had not been feeling well, and after many tests, an MRI showed a large mass on her Pancreas. Her local doctor scheduled a biopsy in Pittsburgh but told her that the MRI reflected that it was likely cancer pancreatic cancer. I offered to pray with her. She had *many* people praying: her church community, friends, and those I contacted in our charismatic community.

A few days before Christmas she called and said she was home if I wanted to come and pray. I quickly put my blessed oil, a rosary, and a green scapular (for the sick) in my purse and drove to her house. On the way I started to panic. I knew I needed to pray in tongues for her and was not comfortable doing so, she had never experienced it. I prayed, "Lord, I am the most unworthy person I know, and I wish there was someone else to pray over Carol, but since I am the only one, please use me to bring your healing love to my friend."

We talked, we cried and then I anointed her with the oil, and laid hands on her and prayed. I prayed in tongues, and the anointing of the Holy Spirit came over me. As I headed home, I prayed again and claimed healing for her, and prayed that I would be able to see her again when I come home from Florida in the spring.

I have continued to pray (as have many others) for her every day in tongues ("the Spirit makes intercession for us in words and groanings that we can't understand") and included her name in my daily rosary.

Sunday, January 6<sup>th</sup>, I got a call from her. She received a call about the biopsy. The results were that the growths are NOT cancer. They are benign! NOT PANCREATIC CANCER! even though that is truly what the picture from the MRI looked like and what the doctors strongly suspected. How can this be? In addition, she had all the symptoms of pancreatic cancer.

So, "NOT CANCEROUS" is a miracle and God began healing her body when I and others began to pray after the MRI. She thanked me for laying hands on her and said she needed that. She said she felt peaceful after that prayer. I am praying (and ask you to pray) that our Lord will continue healing her until the benign growths and other symptoms are

completely gone. Brothers and sisters, we serve a good, loving, and all-powerful God. Believe it!

If you are like me, afraid to use your charismatic gifts, remember that the Holy Spirit gives us these gifts for primarily for others. Of course, I am unworthy. I am a sinner. But when I pray, Jesus covers me with His precious Blood and can use me to bring His love and healing to others.

I got out of my boat (my comfort zone) and walked on the water, trusting Jesus because my friend needed Him, and I am overcome with joy; praising His greatness and mercy.

## WHY DO I STAY IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH? By Elaine Sinnott

I remember hearing everything on the news on a Tuesday evening about the cover-ups in the Catholic Church; in my very own state of Pennsylvania and in my very own diocese. Priests whom my friends and family knew were on that list of those accused of the gravest of abuses. They were devastated. Priests who were close to friends of mine and priests who married family members were on that list. I couldn't believe it! I knew it was a problem in the Church, but I had absolutely no idea the extent of it. And this was JUST in Pennsylvania. And only the reported/discovered cases.

I went to Mass the next day since it was a holy day of obligation, even though I was feeling confused, sad, overwhelmed, sickened, and betrayed. I didn't want to be there, but I still felt drawn to be there. What was calling me there? How on earth could this happen?? How could these "leaders" we've trusted, these "Godly" men, do this? My head and my emotions were spinning.

I was asking these questions in my heart as I knelt there, staring at the tabernacle before Mass began. And then suddenly the Holy Spirit descended upon me with peace and spoke these words to me: "The heart of My Church is still pure. My Body, given for you, is still pure."

## THIS is what was drawing me! HE was still there!

At the beginning of the day, I was wanting to hide the fact that I was Catholic. *This interruption* immediately made me want to cling to my Faith and Church more than anything, and to protect it. In this deep meditation, a very vivid image came to my mind of me as a child clutching to a mother figure, wrapping my arms around her legs and holding tight. I was NOT going to let go!

My pastor began Mass and while he is usually extremely upbeat with his homilies, he was completely different. He had such sadness in his eyes and no personality in his voice. You could tell it was truly hurting him to be there. It was truly a *sacrifice* for him to come and celebrate with us in the midst of his own brokenness and betrayal by his brother priests.

This priest is one of many who are truly holy, who are doing what they said he would do for God when they were ordained. But now, after this report came out, priests like him were getting attacked verbally and even physically across the country (they did the same to Jesus). All it takes is for one bad one to ruin it for everyone else and this time there was a crushing number of 300+ bad ones. I'm sure it made the good priests feeling like they were gasping for air. And I'm sure it made many faithful feel as if they couldn't trust any of them. But this is just a lie that the devil wants us to believe.

The words Jesus spoke in John 6:67 came to mind, "Do you also want to leave?" (NABRE).

Even though I felt incredibly hurt and betrayed, I never once felt betrayed by the Church. I never once felt the desire to leave it. This awful attack on our Church from those within our very ranks only made me want to be closer to Her even more. I know that the people who committed these horrendous abuses and the people who looked the other way are not living according to the gospel or what this beautiful Church teaches. It is sin, plain and simple. Grave sin. People are so sickened by these events and the corruption in our Church (and rightfully so!) that they are leaving the Church. It was sinful men following evil and selfish desires. May God have mercy on their souls for the damage they inflicted on the victims and the damage done to the Church. But it is not Christ's Church who attacked these poor victims. And I love this dear Church and see all of the beauty that remains in her, her priests, the faithful.

Then the Holy Spirit reminded me of Peter's comforting words in response to Jesus' question, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life," (John 6:68, NABRE). Lord, I will not leave.

Let us cling to Jesus and not abandon His church when she needs us the most! We need good, holy religious men and women and lay people to protect what Jesus began in that Upper Room 2,000 years ago. Satan is going to do whatever he possibly can to rip us apart and make the church collapse, but with Jesus at the core...the Eucharist... we have a strength the devil will **NEVER** match!

"Your unfailing love, O Lord, is as vast as the heavens; your faithfulness reaches beyond the clouds. Your righteousness is like the mighty mountains, your justice like the ocean depths. Pour out your unfailing love on those who love you; give justice to those with honest hearts. Look! Those who do evil have fallen! They are thrown down, never to rise again." (Ps 36:5-6,10, 12, NLT)

To a detrimental extent, we as Catholics are not aware that the Gifts of the Holy Spirit are for today: "The authentic charisms, therefore, come to be considered as gifts of indispensable importance for the life and mission of the Church." (CDF, *Iuvenescit Ecclesia*, 9)

And the charisms (Gifts) are not for only a few: "I expect you to share with everyone in the Church the grace of the baptism in the Holy Spirit" (Pope Francis to the Charismatic renewal). At the same time, we fail to comprehend the vital importance and protection of the Bible; the breathed and inspired Word of GOD almighty. It is "living and active; sharper than any two-edged sword. It pierces even to dividing soul and spirit" (Heb 4:12) [i.e., surgically separate; as with a scalpel]

Two of the earliest Christian roots, the Word of God and the Spirit of God, are authentic co-evangelists. They preach together! The Word of God CREATES through the SPIRIT of God! It was true in Genesis when the Spirit of God hovered over the waters, awaiting the command of God to create the universe. It was true when John proclaimed that "the Word of God became flesh and dwelt among us" AND IT IS STILL TRUE TODAY.

We need to be intimately familiar with this Letter to us from God; otherwise, we risk falling victim to people who pick who have their own agendas and who and particular scriptures choose while ignoring others. No matter knowledgeable they may sound, they are not speaking through the power of the Holy Spirit. If you hear the Word without the Spirit, beware of "wolves in sheep's clothing." Satan tried to use the Word of God without the Spirit of God. He manipulated scripture against Jesus in the desert to try to confuse Him and get Him to sin. Jesus discerned that it was wrong and fought back with the Sword of the Holy Spirit (the correct scriptures). If the devil thought he might be able to tempt even Jesus into sin by misusing scripture, how much more so will he try it with us! Surely humility and complete dependence on the Word of God and the Holy Spirit, these early firm foundations, are in order.

If we are Spirit-filled but are only seeking the mountaintop experiences that happen as we walk in the Spirit, there is danger also – the air is THIN up there! (lol) "We urge you not to receive the grace of God in vain" (2 Cor 6:1, NASB). We risk deception. The same great danger of deception exists for those who have not the received the Baptism in the Spirit; being unable to discern danger: "for false Christs and false prophets shall arise and will give signs and wonders that would deceive, if it were possible, even the elect. So be on your guard; I have told you everything in advance." (Mark 13:22-23, BLT; emphasis added). We must follow the Savior, being vigilant of both the true signs and wonders (which abound) that He commissioned to believers, while being on guard for the false, lying wonders of the evil one, intended to lead everyone, especially the elect (chosen), astray. There is no room for any of us to get comfortable and coast when Jesus warned: "be on your guard"!

Surely as I write this message, I feel conviction in my own heart. The intention is *not to offend*. It is to give a little solid food instead of milk for babies, because we must all grow. The hope is that this message touches you in a place your soul requires. Because God intended us to live, not standing still, but "being transformed from glory to glory, for this comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit" (2 COR 3:18, CSB; emphasis added). So, ONWARD!

My dear friends in Christ, let us all return to that moment when the Church received the power to carry out her commission from God; the moment that the Church (you and I) gained any capacity for success at affecting this world whatsoever. Let us return to the moment that God imbued 120 believers with so great a power, that it was the very instant that they could not be stopped, and the gospel began to make its way "throughout the ends of the earth" (Acts

It is necessary in the strongest possible way, for us to be 'traditional Catholics,' FULL of the MYSTICAL POWER that can only be given through Jesus' gift of the HOLY SPIRIT and the "SWORD of the [Holy] SPIRIT, which is the WORD of GOD"! (Eph 6:17.) Full of awe; full of

reverence; full of *Truth*; and full of *faith* that **cannot be stopped.**
